I did however locate a dog head picture that I would like to use as well. If both pictures are available for outside use, I would like to use them for propaganda and album artwork for my ensemble. Please send me any information to obtain use of these photographs.

My ensemble, Robot vs Rabbit, is a mechanical disturbance from a state of equilibrium that propagates through an elastic material medium. A purely subjective definition of sound is also possible, as that which is perceived by the ear, but it is not particularly illuminating and is unduly restrictive. If you are interested, I can send you a free copy of our cdr for your listening pleasure. I have also included links to our sites as well.

SRL AND FBI:

The mystery surrounding an incident that took place on Nov. 28th 1995 following the SRL "Crimewave" show has finally been solved. After the event, police and fire dept. officials surrounded and cordoned off the show area. Mark Pauline and Mike Dingle were questioned by assorted representatives of these two departments. One plainclothes officer, Mike Mahoney introduced himself to Mark Pauline as an agent of the SFPD's "Environmental Crimes Unit". I le requested an interview with Mark Pauline and suggested that it take place in his unmarked car. He also suggested it would be convenient to tape record the conversation for ease of review at a later date. A lengthy interview took place which included queries about the Unabom puppets used in the event, explosives, machines, personal details about Mark Paulines life history, and the nature and purpose of SRL and its activities. Strangely enough, no mention was ever made of environmental crimes. The following day, as SRL crew was clearing the last remnants of the show, "Mysterious Mike" as we had taken to calling him, returned to the site in a new Ford Taurus fitted with "gov" plates. He had another man with him. Both wore grey suits and sunglasses. The SRL crew cheerfully waved to Mike and his friend but were greeted with blank stares. The following article, published

Sacramento Bombing Yielded Telling Clues

Fatal blast at timber industry office painted Unabomber as Pro-environment.

Sacramento

At the office of the California Forestry Association where lobbyist Gilbert Murray was killed in the most recent attack attributed to the Unabomber workers said yesterday that they believed evidence left by the killer contributed to the arrest of Theodore Kaczynski. The staff of the trade association was making plans Wednesday afternoon for commemorating the one year anniversary of Murray's death on April 24 when news arrived that an arrest had been made in Montana. Don Zea, vice president of the association, said the explosion in the one-story brick building three blocks north of the state Capitol provided the FBI "a whole new set of experiences and clues . " Zea said the association was the first clearly environment-related target of the bomber, who had previously sent his carefully crafted parcels to computer technicians, academics, engineers and airlines. One day after the Sacramento blast, a Unabomber letter to the New York Times spelled out an anti-technology, pro-environmental agenda. The letter explained for the first time that a fatal bomb had been sent to a New Jersey public relations executive in December 1994 because his firm "helped Exxon clean up its public image after the Exxon Valdez incident." Zea said that after the Sacramento explosion, the FBI added an "environmental crimes unit" to the investigation. The FBI did not return phone calls yesterday about

Section 3.104 of the San Francisco Fire Code empowers the member issuing this notice to enforce all provisions of the San Francisco Fire Code by the exercise of arrest and/or citation authority. Section 3.105 states that any person who violates, disobeys, omits, neglects, or refuses to comply with any of the provisions of this code or any lawful order issued pursuant thereto shall be guilty of an infraction or misdemeanor.

PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS

Every violation is punishable by (1) a fine not exceeding \$100 for a first violation; (2) a fine not exceeding \$200 for a second violation; (3) a fine not exceeding \$500 for a third or more violation of the same ordinance within one year. If charged as an infraction, the penalty upon conviction therefor shall be not less than \$50 or more than \$500, no part of which may be suspended. If charged as a misdemeanor, the penalty upon conviction therefor shall be a fine of not less than \$500 or more than \$1,000 or imprisonment in the county jail, not exceeding 6 months, or both fine and imprisonment, no part of which may be suspended. Every day such violation, disobedience, omission, neglect or refusal shall continue shall be considered as a new offence. Any person who shall do any work in violation of any of the provisions of this code, and any person having charged of such work who shall permit it to be done, shall be liable to the penalty provided.

In addition, under the provisions of the San Francisco Fire Code, (Section 3.104(d)) the owner of an occupancy is liable for the cost of reinspecting any structure where a code violation has been found. Payment of the above amount is due within sixty (60) days of this notice. The fee is computed on the rate of \$15.00 per quarter hour or part thereof, with an initial minimum charge of \$60.00. The department shall collect a fee in the amount of \$60.00 to compensate the department for its cost to perform each reinspection. On site inspections which require more than one hour to complete shall be subject to an additional fee at the rate of \$15.00 for each quarter-hour increment beyond the first 60 minutes.

Mysterious explosions reverberated through the Bay Area on Sunday, but exactly what caused the booms and rumbles remained a matter of some dispute.

Lt. Cmdr. Sandy Stair of the Navy command at Treasure Island said there were some naval flares shot off in the early afternoon.

But Stair doubted the flares would make enough noise to be heard in The City, nor were they shot off into the early evening, when the booms were still audible.

Thunder, lightning, humidity and a meteor in the Bay. What's next? A full apocalypse? And what about those big booms that shook San Francisco? Not the ones Saturday night in San Jose caused by ZZ Top's music bouncing off a temperature-inversion layer. We're talking about some big booms that mystified San Francisco police Sunday afternoon, and were blamed on military exercises being held by the Navy and Marines.

Not so, says a bird watcher. And who are you going to believe, the cops or a bird watcher? Toby Levine was birding in wetlands east of the Basin Industrial Park between Islais Creek Channel and India Basin. She heard "an enormous explosion" at about 4 p.m., so loud that she thought the PG&E plant had blown up. "It was terribly noisy," she said. "All the birds took off."

As Levine left, she went past the Royal Tallow & Soap Division of Darling Delaware Corp. on Amador Street. "It looked like guerrilla theater," she said. People were sticking microphones and cameras in the faces of anyone who complained.

Harvey Allen, a supervisor at Royal Tallow, thought his company had blown up. "Somebody was testing something like a jet engine, like one of the V-2 rockets," he said. "Flame came out of the back."

The man with the rocket identified himself as an inventor with a shop on Army Street. He said the noises annoyed the neighbors on Army Street, and the police and fire department told him to move his testing to the empty streets near Islais Creek. The engine is about 8 feet long and 3 feet in diameter, mounted on a trailer pulled by a pickup truck. It would be nice to say "only in San Francisco," but Iraq has mobile Scud missiles too.

Dear Mark Pauline:

I head the Tibetan Broadcast Service of the Voice of America. I covered the panel session on "Cybervision" at the Kennedy Center in Washington, DC, recently, at which you spoke. I did this partly because of my interest and pleasure in SRL, partly because I thought SRL's guerrilla war against the status quo would be much appreciated in China-occupied-Tibet, and partly as an experiment in cross-cultural communication. I wrote a sympathetic piece which we are translating now into Tibetan--no obvious problems in translation yet, except explaining what a guinea pig is--best regards to Stu if he's still around. This next week we will broadcast the piece to a devoted audience in Tibet, India, Nepal, and Bhutan--with voice-over cuts of a few things you said at the panel session. The Current Affairs division at VOA is interested in making the piece available to the other language services, so an account of SRL's exploits may soon be broadcast around the world in many languages.

Anyway, as tribute to the pleasure you've given me, I offer you as a gift my copy of the original translation of Karel Capek's "R.U.R.," for which Capek invented the word "robot." One of the cuts in the piece we'll broadcast has you saying that SRL functions in the service of the machines, which reminded me of the human/machine reversal at the end of Capek's play.

I'm also sending you as a gift a set of Godzilla post cards, which I got in Japan about ten years ago.

May these somehow contribute to your efforts. And may Tibetans become fans of SRL!

Cops probe 'bombs' at beach

Plaster of Paris packages used in performance art'

EXAMINER STAFF REPORT

Authorities closed Great Highway, called the bomb squad and knew precisely what to do Sunday when parcels marked "high explosive TNT" were found Sunday on federal park property at Ocean Beach and the Marin Headlands.

They weren't quite so certain Wednesday while checking reports that the packages, filled with plaster of Paris, had been scattered by mistake and grabbed by people in the audience Saturday at an artistic event known as "performance art."

The art, such as it is, continued when Sgt. Jerry Senkir of the San Francisco police referred inquiries to the government, but FBI spokesman Chuck Latting was quoted by Bay Cities News Service as saying the hoax had a low priority.

He said no violation of federal law was apparent.

The fake bombs were said to be part of a show in a South of Market parking lot. Bags containing the parcels broke, scattering the parcels.

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A two-mile stretch of the Great Highway was closed three times on Memorial Day after explosive devices were found near a construction site along the beach.

The bomblike devices appear to have been elements in a larger scheme, police said. Two similarly constructed devices also turned up Monday morning in the Marin Headlands just north of the Golden Gate Bridge.

About an hour later, park main--mtenance workers spotted two more devices near Battery Spencer in the Marin Headlands, just north of the Golden Gate Bridge.

Bomb experts then were called ed rs back to the beach when the construction company security guard at found a fourth battery-sized explo-



sive around 4 p.m.

As police began sweeping the beach for more explosives, a jogger found the fifth device close to the water at the Great Highway and Judah Street about 6:30 p.m.

Police closed the highway from Sloat Boulevard to Lincoln Way while they removed the explosives.

"We haven't received any. threats and as far as we know the construction company hasn't received any threats," McCarthy said.

Park Police say they have been unable to link the inert bombs to an explosion at the construction site Friday night.

"As far as we can tell, it can't be confirmed that that has anything to do with this," McCarthy said. "There were lots of hazardous materials that could have caused that.'

McCarthy said police would sweep the beach again Tuesday.

"If this is just someone's practical joke we don't know how far it's going and how many there are," he said.
